Identify the structure for saying how old they are and modify the sentence using different number words. Begin to recognise the verb 'to have' in first person present (Tengo). Explain what a cognate is and suggest examples. Apply and describe different detective skills: using logic, context and knowledge of language.

z	Diez (ten) Pronounced as 'th'
Soft c	C + e in cero, once, doce, trece and quince (zero, eleven, twelve and thirteen, fifteen). C + i in cinco, dieciséis, diecisiete, dieciocho, diecinueve (five, sixteen, seventeen, eighteen, nineteen).
j	In jueves (thursday), junio and julio (june and july).
