

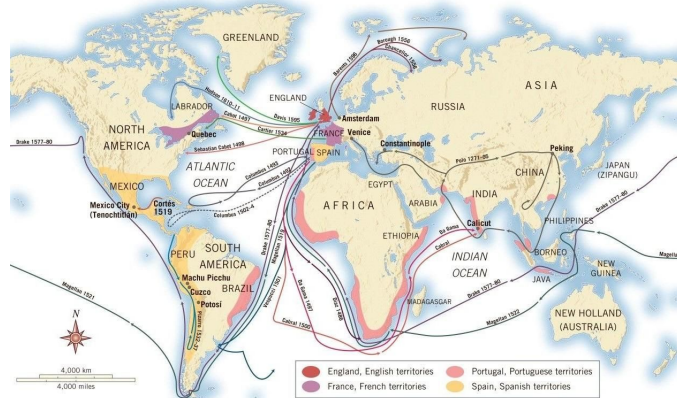
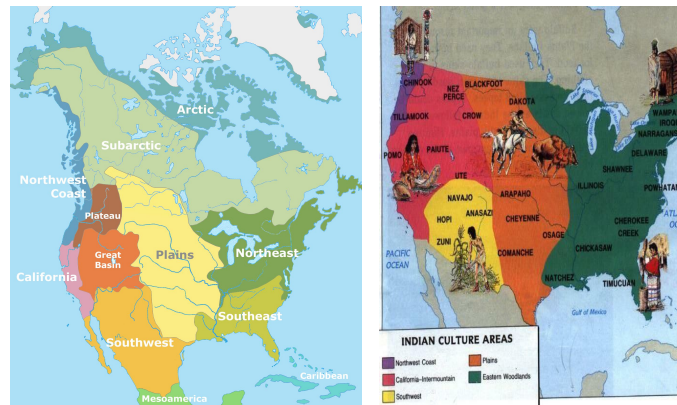

## Way Out West: The culture and geography of Indigenous Americans

Physical Features	
<b>natural resources</b>	Materials or substances that are produced by the environment.
<b>plains</b>	A broad area of relatively flat land.
<b>oil</b>	Carbon-based liquid formed from fossilised animals.
<b>gas</b>	As plants grow and then die, they are buried by rocks and sediment and put under a lot of pressure over a very long time. As temperature and pressure increases, the plant material is changed and forms gas.

Human Features	
<b>trade route</b>	Is an area or prescribed passage by land or sea used by merchants and caravans for economic purposes.
<b>voyage</b>	A long journey to a foreign or distant place, especially by sea.
<b>territory</b>	A portion of geographic space that is claimed or occupied by a person or group of persons or by an institution.
<b>migrate</b>	The movement of humans from one place to another.
<b>resources</b>	Any physical material constituting part of Earth that people need and value.
<b>land claims</b>	The pursuit of recognised territorial ownership by a group or individual.
<b>custom</b>	The frequent repetition of an act, to the extent that it becomes characteristic of the group of people performing the act.

Key Places	
<b>North America</b>	Is a continent entirely within the Northern Hemisphere.
<b>California</b>	The geographic area within the current boundaries of California before and after the arrival of Europeans.
<b>Arctic and Sub-arctic</b>	The arctic region sits inside the Arctic Circle and the subarctic region lies just below it.
<b>Great Plains</b>	A vast high plateau of semi arid grassland. Their altitude at the base of the Rockies in the United States is between 1,500 and 1,800 metres.



Key Vocabulary	
<b>tribe</b>	A group of people who live and work together in a shared geographical area.
<b>Inuit Tribe</b>	A group of culturally similar indigenous peoples inhabiting the Arctic regions.
<b>California Tribe</b>	The indigenous inhabitants who have lived in the geographic area within the current boundaries of California before the arrival of Europeans.
<b>Apache Tribe</b>	A member of a Native American people inhabiting the southwest United States and northern Mexico.
<b>main staple</b>	Produced, regularly used, needed, or enjoyed constantly usually by many individuals in large quantities - for example staple crops such as wheat and rice.
<b>igloo</b>	A snow house or snow hut or a type of shelter built of snow, typically built when the snow is suitable.
<b>wigwam</b>	A semi-permanent domed dwelling formerly used by certain Indigenous American tribes.
<b>teepee</b>	A tent, traditionally made of animal skins on wooden poles.
<b>indigenous</b>	Refers to people or objects that originate from a certain region or environment.
