Physical Features	
<b>sand</b>	Rocks that have divided into small grains.
<b>pebble</b>	Small stone made smooth by the water.
<b>cave</b>	A natural opening in the Earth.
<b>rockpool</b>	A pool of sea water among rocks along the shore.
Human Features	
<b>shop</b>	A place where you can buy things.
<b>road</b>	A wide path that vehicles can use.
<b>house</b>	A building that people live in.
<b>harbour</b>	A place where ships can be left safely.
<b>fairground</b>	An outdoor area where a fair is held.
<b>lighthouse</b>	A tower with a light to warn or guide ships.



Key Places	
<b>London</b>	The capital and largest city of England and the United Kingdom.
<b>England</b>	England is a country in the United Kingdom. It is bordered by Wales and Scotland.
<b>Scotland</b>	Is a country in the northern part of Great Britain.
<b>Edinburgh</b>	The capital city of Scotland.
<b>Wales</b>	Is a country in the western part of Great Britain.
<b>Cardiff</b>	The capital city of Wales.
<b>Northern Ireland</b>	Is a country in the northeast part of the island of Ireland.
<b>Belfast</b>	The capital city of Northern Ireland.
<b>English Channel</b>	The channel which is an arm of the Atlantic Ocean and separates Southern England from France.
<b>North Sea</b>	Part of the Atlantic Ocean between Great Britain and Western Europe.
<b>Irish Sea</b>	It is a sea that separates Great Britain from the island of Ireland.
<b>Atlantic Ocean</b>	The world's second largest ocean and it surrounds the UK.

<b>United Kingdom</b>	The United Kingdom is used to refer to Great Britain and Northern Ireland. It is made up of four countries.
<b>Great Britain</b>	It is a landmass that is made up of Wales, Scotland and England.
<b>island</b>	A piece of land surrounded by water.
<b>cliff</b>	Is a vertical rock on a coast.
<b>coast</b>	A part of land near the sea.
<b>pier</b>	A structure built above water.
<b>promenade</b>	A large, long open area next to water where people can walk.
<b>bay</b>	Where the land curves inwards by the sea.
<b>beach</b>	A pebbly or sandy shore.
<b>sea</b>	A large area of water surrounded by land.
