Fiction: Portal Tale

Evaluate and edit writing, correcting consistency in spelling and punctuation.

Non-Fiction: Non Chronological Report


Plan, draft and write a non chronological report considering organisational devices.

Ensure there is a consistent and correct use of tense throughout a piece of writing.

Use passive voice correctly.

Poetry: Rainforest poetry

Plan and perform poetry based on deforestation, considering the themes in the poem.





Maths

Shape

Draw lines and angles accurately.

Calculate angles around a point and on a straight line.

Calculate missing angles and lengths in shapes.

Explore regular and irregular polygons and describe the properties of 3D shapes.

Position and direction

Read and plot coordinates.

Translate coordinates in all four quadrants.

Identify, describe and represent the position of a shape following a reflection or translation.

Decimals

Use known facts to add and subtract decimals within 1.

Add and subject decimals across 1.

Add decimals with the same number of decimals.



Geography

South America

Locate countries, capital cities and key human and physical features across South America.

Use maps, atlases and globes to locate the features studied. Describe and understand the key aspects of climate zones and biomes located across South America.

Develop and understanding of the migration push and pull factors for people living in the Amazon basin.

Frame structures (mechanisms): Construct a moving fairground



Research and design a fairground ride (ferris wheel) to be a new attraction at Walton on the Naze.
