Know that the ending of an adjective often changes according to the gender and number of the noun it describes.
Third person singular of verbs TO HAVE and TO BE [tiene, es]
Know that a statement can be made into a question simply by changing your intonation and punctuation, e.g.
¿Tiene ojos azules? ¿Es Ana? [does he/she have blue eyes? Is she Ana?]

Culture

Cubist movement and key Cubist artists in Spain.

Began in the early 20th century. Artists showed objects from different angles at the same time, breaking them into geometric shapes. Paintings often look fragmented and abstract, focusing more on structure and form than realism.

- Pablo Picasso (1881–1973)
- Juan Gris (1887–1927)
- María Blanchard (1881–1932)



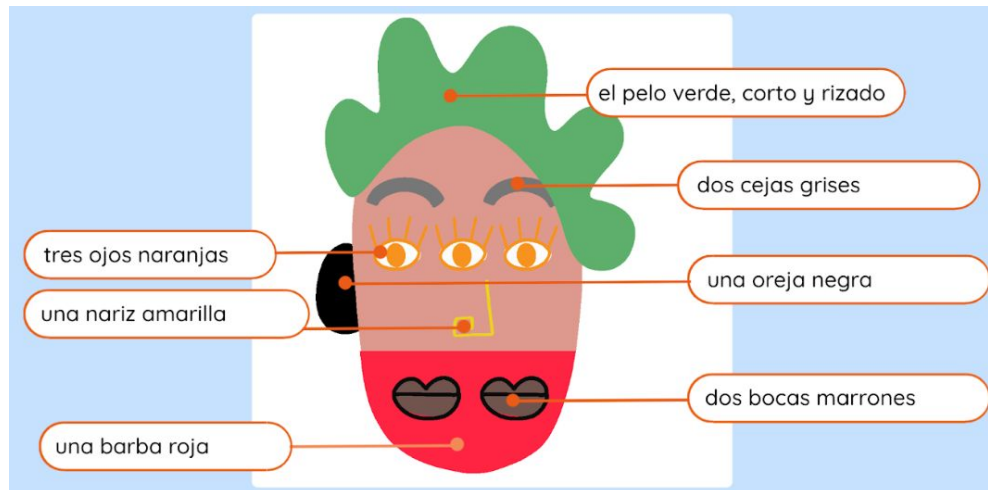
Key Sounds
