Indefinite articles, negative and high frequency verbs.
 Revisiting first person singular high frequency verbs 'me llamo', 'tengo', 'soy' with a particular focus on 'vivo' from the verb VIVIR, a regular IR verb.
 Use of negative structure appropriate in this unit, 'there is' and 'there is not' (hay and no hay) structure.
 Noting the upside-down question mark (¿) is used at the beginning of all questions-no exceptions!

Spanish Homes & Spring Festivals

In Spain, houses are often designed to stay cool during the hot sun. In the south (Andalusia), many people have a patio, an open-air courtyard in the middle of the house filled with plants, fountains, and colorful tiles.

The Giant House-Burning Festival: Las Fallas From March 1st to 19th, the city of Valencia celebrates Las Fallas.

- What happens? Artists build massive, beautiful statues called ninots (some are as tall as a house!).
- The Big Finish: On the final night, they set fire to all of them in giant street bonfires to celebrate the arrival of Spring.
