

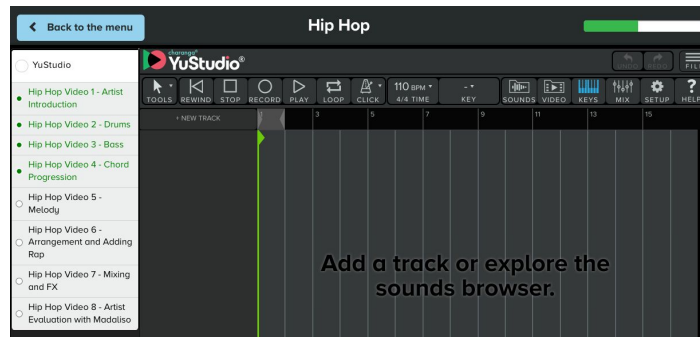

	In collaboration with lyricist Tim Rice, Andrew Lloyd Webber has produced many musical theatre shows. In 1992, he was knighted by Queen Elizabeth II and became known as Sir Andrew Lloyd Webber. Since then he also become a baron and His full title is The Lord Lloyd-Webber.	
Shows	His shows are famous for their blend of different styles of music, including rock and roll and classical opera. They are also known for their dramatic staging and memorable melodies. Awards	Lloyd Webber has had a very successful career, winning many awards, including: Three Grammy awards and one Grammy Legend award, seven Tony awards, seven Olivier awards, an Oscar, an International Emmy, a Golden Globe award. He also has a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame for services to theatre.

A musical	A film with a variety of songs which help tell the story.
opera	A form of theatre where the whole play is sung. Opera is usually classical music.
timbre	The quality and difference of sounds between instruments
Hip hop	Hip-hop or hip hop music, also known as rap, and formerly as disco rap, is a genre of popular music that originated in the early 1970s by African Americans and Caribbean immigrants in the Bronx, a borough of New York City.
lyricist	A person who writes lyrics for a living.
Bass	Low sounds. Hip hop usually uses a bass guitar or electric bass sounds.
Kick drum	The kick is the largest drum on a drum kit and the foot is used to play it.
snare	A drum with coiled metal under it to create a specific timbre. Part of a drum kit.
hi-hat	Two cymbals joined together. Part of a drum kit. Closed hi-hat makes a short 'ts' sound and open high hat makes a longer 'tsss' sound.
