

THE ECO SCHOOLS PROGRAMME

The Eco Schools Programme is made up of seven steps to help pupils take environmental action:

- 3. Make an action plan
- 4. Make an Eco Code
- 5. Include environment across the curriculum
- 6. Keep the whole school informed
- 7. Measure the impact of projects

Litter






From our Environmental Review we will focus our actions on:

We will:


- Have energy monitors in every class to ensure devices and lights are switched off when not in use.

ACTION PLAN


BIODIVERSITY

We will:
